**Name of the Event:** Cleanliness drive at Devi Talab Mandir, Jalandhar

**REPORT:** A cleanliness drive at the Devi Talab Mandir in Jalandhar highlights the community's commitment to maintaining the sanctity and beauty of this historic and religious site. The drive involves volunteers, temple staff, and local authorities working together to clean the temple premises, including its sacred pond and surroundings. This initiative helps preserve the environment and promotes awareness of hygiene and the importance of keeping religious spaces clean. Such efforts reflect both environmental stewardship and spiritual respect within the local community. The Education Department of DAV University, Jalandhar, aligned with the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan mission initiated by the Government of India, conducted a cleanliness drive on 21<sup>st</sup> of July, 2022. A day trip was organized under community work at Devi Talab Mandir. It is situated in the heart of Jalandhar city. It is believed to be more than 200 years old. The temple is dedicated to Goddess Durga and is one of the 51 Shakti Pithas in India. Students took the initiative of cleaning the temple and the adjoining road leading to the nearby temple. The education department arranged a cleanliness drive in the adjoining area to make common people aware of the necessity and benefits of cleanliness.

**REPORT:** The Gaushala, located on Tanda Road near Devi Talab Mandir in Jalandhar, serves as a sanctuary for stray, abandoned, and sick cows. Gaushala are traditional shelters for cows, providing a safe environment where they can live peacefully, receive proper care, and be protected from harm. The Gaushala plays an essential role in upholding the cultural and religious significance of cows in Hinduism while addressing the practical needs of animal welfare in the region. The Department of Education, DAV University, Jalandhar took the initiative and organized a one-day trip to Gaushala. It is one of the important places where many people come for charity to provide help financially and manually with food etc. The visit consisted of the following activities:

- I. **Feeding the Cows:** The primary activity of the visit was to feed the cows. Each group was provided with a variety of food items, including vegetable mixtures, green mixtures, ladoos, and other green eatables.
- II. **Learning Session:** To enhance the educational aspect of the visit, a learning session was organized. An expert from the Gaushala explained the significance of cow protection in Indian culture, the role of cows in sustainable agriculture, and the challenges faced by cow shelters in the modern era.
- III. **Interactive Session:** Students had the opportunity to ask questions and engage in discussions with the caretakers of the Gaushala, gaining insights into the daily operations and challenges faced by such shelters.

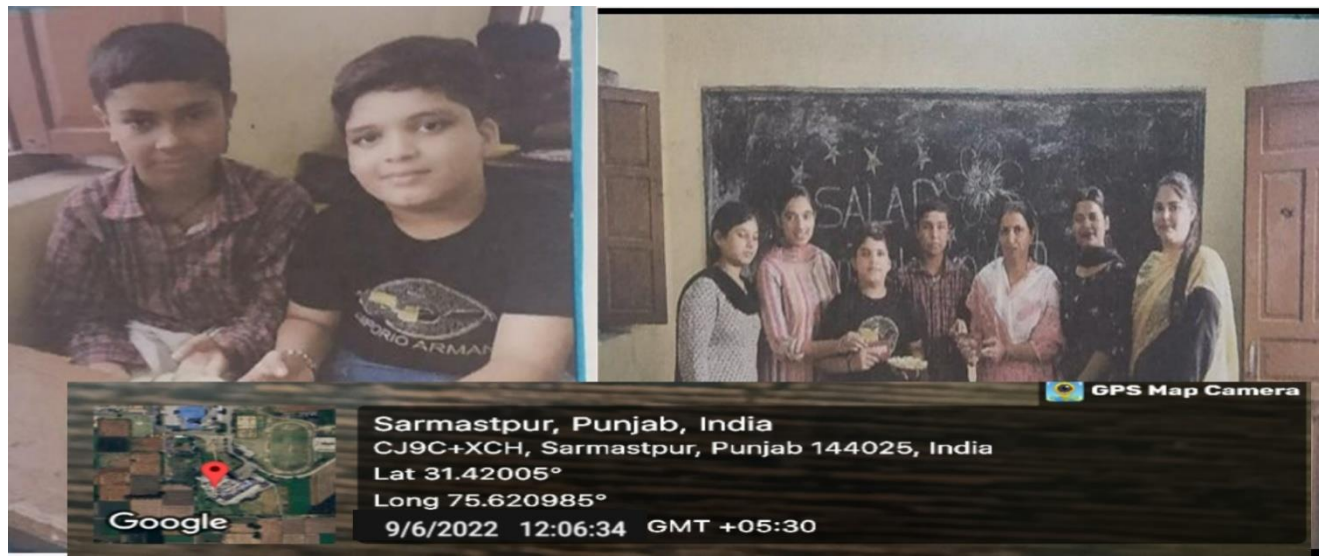
**Name of the Event:** Salad Making Competition at Government Senior Secondary Smart School, Bhogpur

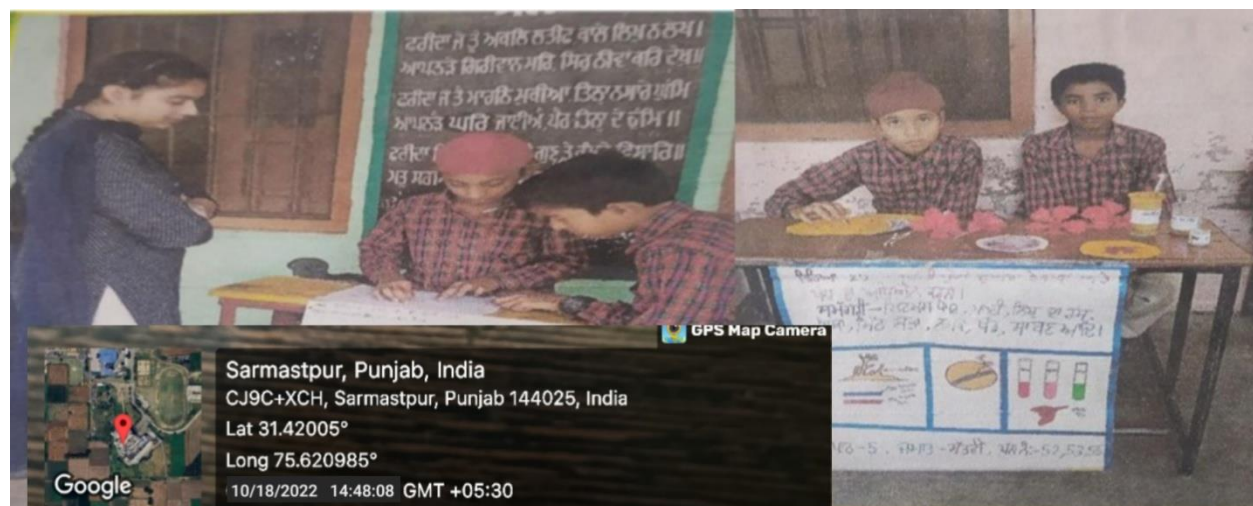

**Name of the Event:** Remedial Teaching at Beas Pind

**REPORT:** In line with its commitment to community engagement and educational empowerment, DAV University, Jalandhar, organized a Remedial Teaching Program for underprivileged children at Beas Pind, a rural village near Jalandhar. This initiative was undertaken by a group of dedicated university students aiming to bridge the learning gaps in the village's education system. The program ran over one week and focused on subjects where students were struggling, primarily on subjects like Mathematics, Science, and English.

**Structure and Planning:** The Remedial Teaching Program was structured to ensure maximum impact and engagement. A team of 20 students from DAV University volunteered for this initiative. The following planning points were implemented:



1. Pupil teachers took the initiative to help the needy and poor students of their locality. These students were given remedial classes to improve their conceptual understanding of various subjects, including Maths, English, and Science.
2. Assistance was provided for completing the homework of these students. For this purpose, regular classes of one hour were taken in the evening by pupil teachers.
3. Pupil teachers interacted with parents of needy students ask about their difficulties regarding studies and motivated them to send their children to schools on regular basis.
4. Apart from subject teaching, pupil teachers mentored the village students. They motivated and guided them for higher studies.
