Name of the Activity: Cleanliness Drive






The quiz competition winners are:

Name of the Event: Chalk Board competition



Report: This report present the details of activity called "Charades with English Words" which was organized by Art and Literature club for B.Sc B.Ed and B.A. B.Ed. Semester II students, with all

students divided into 8 groups, each consisting of 5-6 students. The primary goal of the activity was

to enhance vocabulary, improve communication skills, and foster team dynamics through an

immersive and interactive learning experience.

Activity Structure: The activity was divided into two distinct phases:

Phase I: Paper chits inscribed with unique English words were prepared beforehand and placed in a

bowl. In this phase, a representative from each group was selected to draw a chit from the bowl. The

representative then had to communicate the meaning of the word to their group members using only gestures. Points were awarded to the groups based on their ability to correctly guess the word within a given time limit.

Phase II: Phrase and Idiom Exploration. The second phase introduced phrases and idioms. Following the format of the first phase, a group member was chosen to pick a chit containing a phrase or idiom. The selected student then verbally read the phrase or idiom aloud, and the rest of the group worked together to decipher its meaning. Points were allocated based on the accuracy and clarity of the group's explanation.







- 1. Vocabulary Expansion: Active participation in both phases exposed students to new words, phrases, and idioms, thereby broadening their vocabulary.
- 2. Communication Proficiency: The use of non-verbal cues in Phase I and verbal explanations in Phase II allowed students to refine their communication skills, enabling them to effectively convey complex ideas within a group setting.
- 3. Team Cohesion: The collaborative nature of the activity fostered teamwork as students collectively worked to interpret word meanings and phrases, creating a sense of unity and shared achievement within each group.
- 4. Critical Thinking Development: The task of analyzing and interpreting phrases and idioms encouraged students to engage in critical thinking and contextual understanding, thereby enhancing their problem-solving abilities.
