


# Psychology Dept observes World Mental Health Day

Also the professors in Germany act more as facilitators the teacher student exchange is to a minimum in Germany most of syllabus is acquired in self study, while as here the professor act more like teacher which tediously covey all of the syllabus to the students.

Well the students where are much more connected with their class mates that is probably because in Germany we do not have classes in university, you are a



single student choosing the courses according to yourself so sometimes you have a class with people who you don't know. And for the teachers they are also much closer to their students here in Germany they keep their interactions which the students very limited.

#### What has your experience been like in term of connecting with local students?

I have made friends with the students from my class and building. Everyone is very nice and forthcoming. If I need something or don't understand things they are always there to help.

#### How do you keep in touch with your family back home and you deal with home sickness?

To be honest I haven't been homesick, I kind of feel like I am at home here. I call my parents and my friends every day and that's enough for me. The only thing that I have been missing these past few days is clean air I suppose.

In the opening round, CBME triumphed over Agriculture in both categories, with their women's team winning by 18





#### The Beekeeper of Aleppo: A Tale of courage and sorrows

If you want a book that will break your heart and yet represent the reality of plights of the refugesthen pick up the copy of "The Beekeeper of Aleppo" by Christy Lefteri. The Beekeeper of Aleppo tells the story of Nuri

and Afra, a young Syrian couple who fled Syria after losing both their son and their way of life prior to the 2015 civil conflict. The narrator, Nuri, shares the painful details of their migration to England while figuratively looking the reader in the eye. The chapters alternate between the past, in which Nuri and his cousin Mustafa lived a happy, artistic life in Aleppo, running a bee farm; the present, which is characterised by a mixture of relief and anxiety as Afra and Nuri apply for asylum in Britain; and their harrowing journey through Turkey and Greece.

The reality of Nuri and Afra is also heartbreaking and difficult to read. Throughout the book, however, Lefteri's writing voice is a kind influence that entices you to read more. Many of the characters in The Beekeeper of Aleppo have gone through severe loss and sadness because it is a refugee story. Political violence has cost Mustafa and Nuri their homes, their livelihoods, and their boys. Even the most joyful recollections are tarnished and unpleasant as a result of these losses. For example, the awareness of all the suffering to come clouds the joy Nuri remembers when he reflects on the period before the conflict. Afra, who has been blind since Sami's passing, is especially grieving because all of her visual memories are stored in the past, which is no longer there. In a way, she remains stuck in those memories, unable to live in the present as she once did due to her blindness. Because the story alternates between the present and flashbacks, the novel's structure also reflects the characters' overwhelming feelings of remembrance and loss. The book also examines how the human mind might unintentionally change how it perceives the world in order to shield itself from severe stress and loss. One of the most heartbreaking twists included the couple's suffering and their coping mechanisms.
