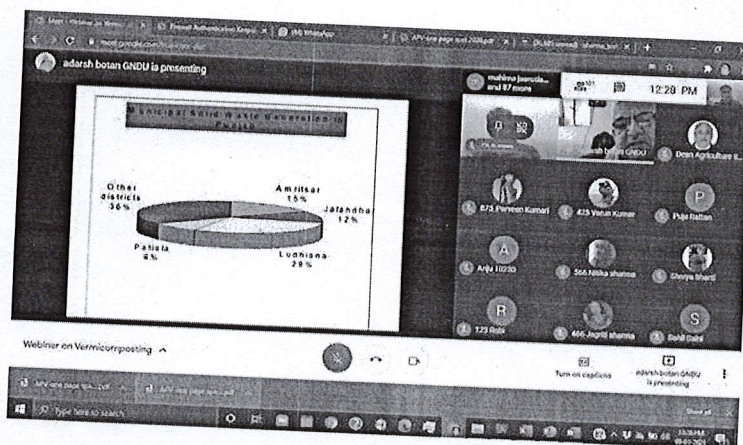

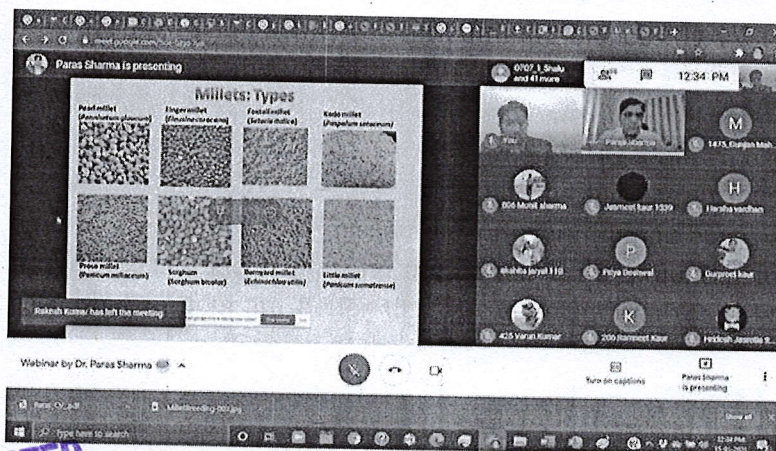

A webinar on ‘Nutrition profile of millets and their possible role in reducing double burden of malnutrition’ was organized by The Faculty of Agricultural Sciences, DAV University Jalandhar on 15th Jan, 2021 at 12:00 noon as the second one of a two webinar series. The resource person, Prof. Paras Sharma (Senior Scientist, ICMR-National Institute of Nutrition, Hyderabad) explained about the malnutrition and the growing concern about the double burden of malnutrition in India. 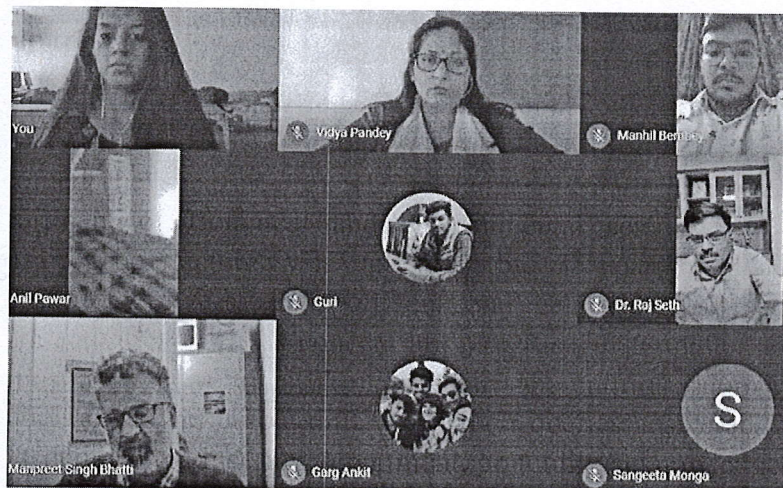

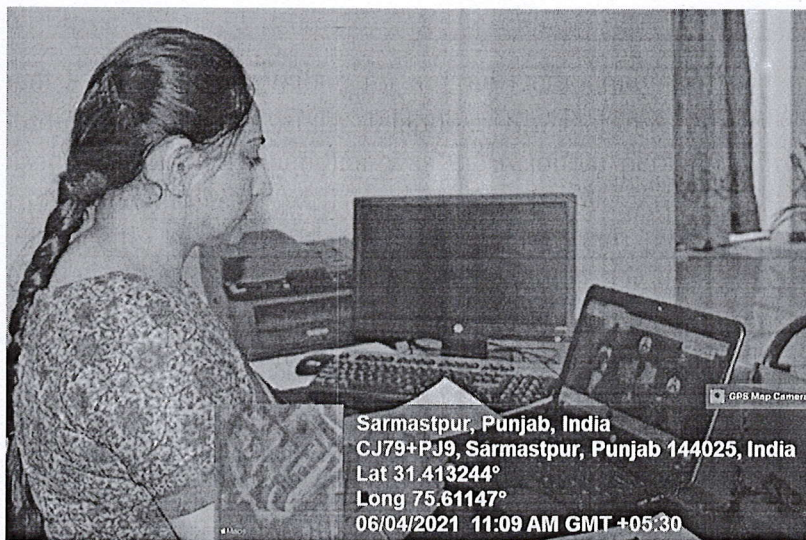

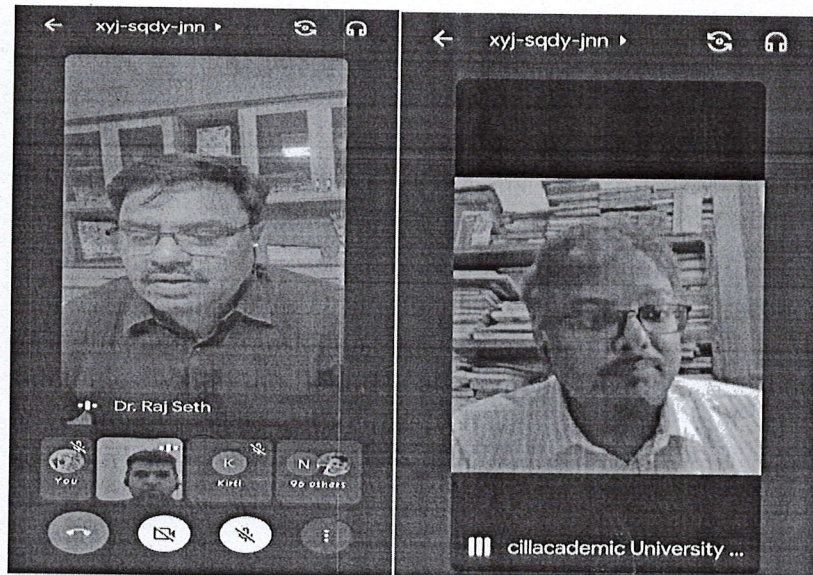
