The Genesis


Maharishi Dayanand Saraswati, a philosopher, thinker and reformer made his advent on the Indian soil when this great country had become oblivious to the glory of its rich culture, tradition and unparalleled heritage. He stood up against social evils `and superstitions prevalent at that time. With the uplifting call "Back to Vedas", the Maharishi rejuvenated and revitalized India intellectually and spiritually, thus bringing about spiritual and social renaissance in society.



The Foundation

Dayanand Anglo Vedic (DAV) College Trust and Management Society, a name that has become synonymous with pristine knowledge, social upliftment and nationalism, came in existence in 1886 about 3 years after the death of Maharishi Dayanand (1824-1883). It was registered under the Societies Registration Act of 1860 and the same year the first DAV institution was established at Lahore with young Hans Raj later known as Mahatma Hans Raj, as the honorary headmaster.





Swami ji's firm conviction was that education was a catalyst of social transformation, and the realization of this dynamic vision has ushered in an era of educational reform. Over the past many decades, hundreds of DAV institutions have emerged throughout the country for both boys and girls so that they can be taught in the art and science of life and in technical skills so as to broaden their mental horizons, unfold their innate abilities and cultivate virtue among them.



The dawning of Dayanand Anglo Vedic College Movement will be incomplete without reference to the contribution of Pt. Gurudatta Vidyarthi. His faith in God and Vedas became firmly rooted in his soul when he sat by the side of Swami Dayanand ji in his last hours. Gurudatta ji's tender heart was greatly touched when he saw the Gayatri Mantra on the lips of the Maharishi just before his departure from this earth.

When it was decided by Arya Samaj, Lahore to immortalize the work of Swami ji by raising educational institutions, Gurudatta Vidyarthi was amongst the first who responded to the call of subscription in aid of the DAV College. Visionaries like Justice Lal Chand, Lala Dwarka Dass, Lala Durga Dass, Principal Sain Das, Bakshi Ram Rattan, Dr. Mukund Lal Puri, Dr. Bakshi Sir Tek Chand and Justice Dr. Mehr Chand Mahajan gave the much needed impetus to the cause of education. The movement gained further momentum under the leadership of Dr. G.L. Dutta, Lala Suraj Bhan, Prof. Ved Vyasa, Shri Darbari Lal, Shri T.R. Tuli and Shri G.P. Chopra.

At present, the DAV flagship is being navigated under the spirited leadership of **Dr. Sh. Punam Suri**, Padma Shree Awardee, who often looks like a monk with a mission spreading the benevolent Vedic philosophy, tirelessly explaining the principles of Arya Samaj for the welfare of mankind, particularly the youth. An illustrious grandson of legendary Mahatma Anand Swami, Shri Punam Suri ji with commitment to the ideology and principles of Arya Samaj and with a crusader like zeal in bringing about reforms is the harbinger of another era of rejuvenation and revitalization of Vedic philosophy. 

DAV University Braves Pandemic, Reopens following **Prescribed Norms**

Life on DAV University campus returned to normalcy amid strict COVID-19 related norms prescribed by the government and University Grants Commission (UGC) to reopen the educational institutions. The university threw its doors open to the postgraduate students of science, engineering and agriculture streams on November 17, 2020 after a gap of eight months. Later, postgraduate students of other academic streams and undergraduate classes also started attending classes in a phased manner.

The University followed strict adherence to precautionary measures including sanitisation, thermal scanning and social distancing. Entry to the campus was permitted to only those wearing face mask.

Awareness about the COVID-19 protocol was disseminated using sign boards. The sign boards also displayed emergency helpline numbers in order to report any illness or respiratory disorder among students or staff. COVID testing camp was also organised by the government health authorities. Automatic hand sanitizers were also installed at important locations likely to witness inflow of visitors for official work.





Research

DAV University receives grant from Punjab Council of Science and Technology for setting up STI Cell

Dr Tejinder Kaur, Nodal Officer

University, Jalandhar has got a grant for setting up Science Technology & Innovation (STI) Cell for the empowerment of SC community by Punjab State Council for Science & Technology with the support of Department of Science & Technology, Govt. of India. The STI Cluster will be



established jointly by DAV University and NIT, Jalandhar. Dr Tejinder Kaur, Coordinator, Department of Zoology will be the Nodal Officer of the project for DAV University.

Under the aegis of this project, DAV University will adopt ten surrounding villages dominated by SC population namely Sarmastpur, Ballan, Kishangarh, Daulatpur, Alawalpur, Mannan, Kala Bakra, Raipur Rasulpur, Naugajja, and Karari. The experts from the University will impart job-oriented training to the residents of these villages. Also, the villagers will be given skill-based training to set-up their own small scale industries. The marginal farmers will be trained for some small scale agro-based processing industry like turmeric processing, honey processing, soya processing (soya milk & tofu), developing bio fertilizers and vermicomposting, utilization

of farm residue by developing them into value added products for farm use. Many technologies will be introduced to the small scale farmers which include protected cultivation, bee keeping, mushroom cultivation, growing high value crops like fruits, flowers and vegetables, nursery for planting material production. They will also be educated and trained to start small dairy, poultry farm, fish farm, piggery, etc. Women self-help groups will be formed where rural women will be trained to make value added products (turmeric powder, ginger paste, garlic paste, pickles and chutney, jams etc.) from farm produce or from locally available raw material and sell their produce using digital platforms. Better quality hybrid seeds will be made available to the farmers to improve crop yield. The residents will be made aware of the IOT based applications like automatic farm monitoring systems, Power management systems, Pollution management, etc. The residents will be given the basic technical knowledge of using smart phones to meet their daily needs like paying electricity bills, online payments, banking, digital marketing of their products, attending online classes, seeking medical help online, etc.

In addition, the university students and faculty members will spread awareness regarding health and hygiene. Overall, this project will help in improving the livelihood framework of the residents of these villages.

First prize under the Education track during MSc Software Indo-Pacific Virtual User Conference 2021







Online Cultural and Technical Events


 DAV University organized inter college/ inter-university cultural competitions, DAV UTSAV 2021(Online). Students from all over the nation participated in this grand event. During the DAV


