

The Genesis

Maharishi Dayanand Saraswati, a philosopher, thinker and reformer made his advent on the Indian soil when this great country had become oblivious to the glory of its rich culture, tradition and unparalleled heritage. He stood up against social evils `and superstitions prevalent at that time. With the uplifting call "Back to Vedas", the Maharishi rejuvenated and revitalized India intellectually and spiritually, thus bringing about spiritual and social renaissance in society.





Dayanand Anglo Vedic (DAV) College Trust and Management Society, a name that has become synonymous with pristine knowledge, social upliftment and nationalism, came in existence in 1886 about 3 years after the death of Maharishi Dayanand (1824-1883). It was registered under the Societies Registration Act of 1860 and the same year the first DAV institution was established at Lahore with young Hans Raj later known as **Mahatma Hans Raj**, as the honorary headmaster. Swami ji's firm conviction was that education was a catalyst of social transformation, and the realization of this dynamic vision has ushered in an era of educational reform. Over the past many decades, hundreds of DAV institutions have emerged throughout the country for both boys and girls so that they can be taught in the art and science of life and in technical skills so as to broaden their mental horizons, unfold their innate abilities and cultivate virtue among them.

The dawning of Dayanand Anglo Vedic College Movement will be incomplete without reference to the contribution of Pt. Gurudatta Vidyarthi. His faith in God and Vedas became firmly rooted in his soul when he sat by the side of Swami Dayanand ji in his last hours. Gurudatta ji's tender heart was greatly touched when he saw the Gayatri Mantra on the lips of the Maharishi just before his departure from this earth.

When it was decided by Arya Samaj, Lahore to immortalize the work of Swami ji by raising educational institutions, Gurudatta Vidyarthi was amongst the first who responded to the call of subscription in aid of the DAV College. Often, he would be found in the company of the then energetic secretary of the Arya Samaj in drafting an appeal and circulating it in aid of DAV. Mahatma Hansraj bestowed a unique feature to the DAV perspective by emphasizing upon the blend of scientific approach and Vedic ethos. He was a strong advocate of discarding superstitions and social evils rampant in the country by stressing upon equality among the young learners, irrespective of caste, creed and colour. He was also a pioneer in the field of women education and empowerment.

Mahatma Hansraj led the Arya Samaj and DAV movement to new heights. He had close contacts with eminent and popular freedom fighters like Lala Lajpat Rai, Bhai Parmanand and Shri Bhim Sain Sachar. As the DAV Movement caught the fancy of the Indian youth, many heroes and martyrs like Sardar Bhagat Singh were inspired to fight for the freedom of the motherland. Visionaries like Justice Lal Chand, Lala Dwarka Dass, Lala Durga Dass, Principal Sain Das, Bakshi Ram Rattan, Dr. Mukund Lal Puri, Dr. Bakshi Sir Tek Chand and Justice Dr. Mehr Chand Mahajan gave the much needed impetus to the cause of education. The movement gained further momentum under the leadership of Dr. G.L. Dutta, Lala Suraj Bhan, Prof. Ved Vyasa, Shri Darbari Lal, Shri T.R. Tuli and Shri G.P. Chopra.

At present, the DAV flagship is being navigated under the spirited leadership of **Dr. Sh. Punam Suri**, Padma Shree Awardee, who often looks like a monk with a mission spreading the benevolent Vedic philosophy, tirelessly explaining the principles of Arya Samaj for the welfare of mankind, particularly the youth. An illustrious grandson of legendary Mahatma Anand Swami, Shri Punam Suri ji with commitment to the ideology and principles of Arya Samaj and with a crusader like zeal in bringing about reforms is the harbinger of another era of rejuvenation and revitalization of Vedic philosophy. The organization is marching ahead taking long strides.



A Ph D and M Tech in Electronics and Communication Engineering (with silver medal) from Punjab Technical University (PTU), Jalandhar, Dr Manoj Kumar is also certified in management and leadership



from Chartered Management Institute, UK. He was also selected for the UK study tour by AICTE and British Council under UK-India Education and Research Initiative (UKIERI) in 2019.

He is known for conceiving novel teaching methodology, attracting industrial collaborations and ensuring qualitative placements of the students. He is a master trainer in leadership management duly recognised by AICTE and the British Council.

Giving details of his priorities after joining, Dr Manoj Kumar said that he aimed at enhancing research and quality education at DAV University. "I aim at making students industry ready and more employable," he said.

He has done outstanding research in the diverse fields of optical and wireless communication. Dr Manoj Kumar also holds the distinction of being one of the top 25 academic leaders across India recognized by Wipro Mission 10X.

He has supervised nine Ph D candidates, published 130 research articles in leading journals and conference proceedings, authored eight textbooks and has two patents to his credit. He is a Reviewer for Elsevier Science's International Journal-Optical Fiber Technology, Springer, ICFAI Journals and World Scientific and Engineering Academy and Society (WSEAS) for international conferences.

He is a Fellow-The Institution of Electronics and Telecommunication Engineers and Institutions of Engineers India, Life Member- The Indian Science Congress Association. Life Member-Computer Society of India, Indian Society of Technical Education, Member, Executive council (Punjab Academy of Sciences and 2009-2012).

Three DAV University researchers figure among top 2 per cent of world scientists

Three members of the faculty at DAV University, Jalandhar - Dr Manik Sharma, Dr Keshav Walia and Dr Rajesh Joshi - have made it to the list of prestigious top two per cent scientists in the world. The current year list was published by Stanford University recently. The names of the two per cent scientists were shortlisted on the basis of standardized parameters including publications, journal impact, citations and composite scores based on their Scopus profile.

Dr Manik Sharma, who is currently the Dean, Faculty of Computer Science and Technology at DAV University, has more than 15 years of teaching and research experience. His research interests include machine learning, optimization techniques, health informatics and smart systems. He is working on designing a smart and innovative decision support system to effectively diagnose and manage behavioural and mental disorders. He is a senior member of IEEE - the world's largest technical professional organization dedicated to advancing technology for the benefit of humanity and a fellow member of the European Alliance for Innovation.

Dr Keshav Walia is an Associate Professor and Coordinator in the Department of Physics. He is an active researcher in the field of theoretical plasma Physics. His research interests include laser-plasma interaction, nonlinear waves in plasma and particle acceleration. He is working on a theoretical investigation of laser-plasma instabilities. The aim of his research is to develop an alternate source of energy by utilizing the technique of laser-driven fusion.


